

# Egypt Study Circle Auction No 39

Closing date for bids April 8, 2005

Welcome to the 39th in our series of successful Auctions, and we hope that there will be something for everyone! But before the bidding, a couple of admin points ...

1. We are concerned that several lots recently have not been fully described as to condition. This has led to an increase in the number being returned by buyers as unsatisfactory. Will vendors please remember that it is in their own interests to describe FULLY the condition. A stamp described as VF is much more likely to sell than one where condition is not described, and both seller and buyer will thus avoid the disappointment of a failed sale. Starting with Auction 40, lots without adequate condition descriptions may be denied entry into the Auction.

2. Our other attempt to overcome the "sight unseen" nature of the sale, the vendors' illustrations, seems to be losing momentum. Clearly – again – it is useful for everyone to be able to see material before bids are made. Will vendors please consider which lots might usefully be illustrated; £5 a page is a little price to pay against the potential gain in information.

As before, black and white illustrations of some lots will accompany the printed Auction list; coloured versions may be seen on <http://groups.msn.com/EgyptStudyCircle>. There is no need to "join" anything on the page; simply clicking on "Pictures" and then "Auction 39" will bring up thumbnails for expansion as required.

Bids arriving after the due date **will be ignored**. Invoices will go out by mid-April, and **must be paid within ten days**; if payment is not received in that time, **the offender's bids may be cancelled**. No lots will be sent out unless the invoice has been **paid in full**. Vendors will be notified to send in lots sold: they must arrive **within seven days of the advice**.

Other conditions:

\* Bids must be placed (and reserves set) within the bidding steps below. Those not conforming will be rounded up (£1.25 will become £1.30, and so on).

\* Prices are reserves rather than estimates; low bids cannot be accepted.

\* Lots are secured at one bidding step above the next highest bidder. In a tie, preference goes to the earlier bidder (judged by postmark or time of email). As material is not with the Auctioneer, and it is not his job to adjudicate, bids specifying conditions will not be accepted.

\* A buyer's commission of 10% and a seller's commission of 5% will be levied to cover Circle costs. Postage and packing of lots won are free of charge unless advised.

\* Bidders are asked to make known any special posting conditions beyond our own insurance.

\* We will continue to review the experimental illustrations and the system used; and hope to extend it. But remember that, as in the past, all material remains with the vendor until "sold".

\* For this reason, buyers may **return within seven days** lots misdescribed as to fact or condition, for a full refund. Please be reasonable: it is not easy to accept return of a mixed lot! If authentication is required, a note or phone call will reserve a potential refund.

*Bidding steps: £1-£5, 10p; £5-£20, 20p; £20-£50, 50p; £50-£100, £1; over £100, £5.*

Mint colour postcard printed by Greek Convent Printing Press, Jerusalem; and another printed by SAG Cairo, franked UAR 2<sup>nd</sup> Anniv (SG 635) and UAR 30m definitive (SG 311), Cairo cancel but large and final central double-ring Couvent Saint Catherine/Sinai handstamp with central symbol.
