- 43 1932, much-travelled Air Mail cover from Bordighera, Italy (4.1.32), franked with five Italian stamps (two damaged) and Air sticker and addressed to passenger aboard vessel at Aden with black AVION JUSQU'À (manuscript Alexandria) on lower face. Brindisi Aerea CDS 6 and 8 Jan, then Recu par Avion Alexandria 9 JA, and Port Said machine transit next day. Boxed Received after/Ship's departure on reverse; redirected to London (arr mark 3 Feb), and finally back to Bordighera (arr 6 Feb). Total of 12 CDS and two directional markings. Remarkable cover **[ILLUSTRATED]** £45
