### Palestine – Gaza

- 81 1950, small cover from Gaza (3 AP 50 CDS), apparently franked with two horizontal pairs of 1948 5-mills general revenue Palestine overprint stamps (Feltus 103). Not valid for postage, so pencil mark "Tax" and Arabic 44, and after 102 purple censor mark on arrival on Cairo the cover was given a vertical pair of 10m Dues (SG D180). Slightly cut down at right, but clean and interesting £28.00
- 82 1959, multi-stamped censored Registered Express cover to Germany. Franked with corner pair of 10m Palestine opts (SG 96) and block of 6 of 35m (SG 96a), cancelled Gaza 5 1 59 with Reg cachet alongside. Purple 14 censor mark, Aerodrome du Caire on reverse, together with four German CDSs and three postman markings. Colourful and remarkable **[ILLUSTRATED]** £38.00
- 83 1967, foolscap-size Arabic-typed certificate issued in Gaza 20 Apr 1967, with tax paid by Palestine overprint revenues – vertical pair of 200m (Feltus 139) and vertical pair and single of 50m (Feltus 148), both pairs tied with violet thumb-print. Unusual document £18.00
- 84 1969-71, collection of 16 undercover mail envelopes sent via Cyprus to avoid mail ban Palestine-Israel-Egypt. All Israeli stamps, used from many unusual small towns – Beit Sahour, Silat el Dahr, Gabalya, Majdal Shams, Bani Suheyla, Azun, Araba, Bir Zeit, Betonya, Yata, Hauara etc. Clean £40.00

### Wreck cover

- 85 1918, small printed cover of Ismail Zohdi, Cairo lawyer, sent from Cairo / B 19 III 18 to Paris. Green rectangular "Passed by Censor B", but then vessel was torpedoed and sunk near Alexandria. Recovered from the sea, it was given a French "Accident du Service" handstamp in violet where stamp had been washed off. Reverse bears imprint of 2x5m and one 10m stamps from other covers, and folded remains of an actual 5m. Remarkably, on arrival, re-addressed within Paris. Important cover for wreck and accident collectors. **[ILLUSTRATED]** £85.00
