- 120 1916? 5m (unwatermarked, HG 6a, NP 6a), Arabic addressed and neatly used from Qutur 31 MR 17. Perfect small strike behind of double-ring Damanhur-Tanta/ & VV (TPO type 7A4, equals Smith's date) and faint Cairo arrival. Message complete, excellent £25
- 121 1916? 5m (unwatermarked, HG 6a, NP 6a), Arabic-addressed to Cairo, cancelled at Damanhur 30 VI 19 with faint Cairo arrival behind. Remarkably, vignette also "cancelled" with double-diagonal-cross censor mark in purple. Sl roughly opened as usual, interior sheets stuck together **[ILLUSTRATED]** £30
- 122 1916? 5m (unwatermarked, HG 6a, NP 6a), Arabic-addressed in pencil to Cairo, uprated with 5m DLR Pictorial (Black on buff Alex Reg label alongside), cancelled Alexandria/ R.1 of 23 FE 20, Cairo arrival same day. Message all there, sl roughness on opening £20
- 123 1916? 5m (unwatermarked, HG 6a, NP 6a), Arabic-addressed in red ink to Cairo (sl smudge does not detract) and cancelled Sidi Gaber 4 7 920. Cairo/ K arrival behind, neat and tidy £20
- 124 1922 5m pink (HG 8, NP 9), Arabic-addressed in pencil, uprated with horiz pair of 5m First Fuad (mute b/w Reg label alongside), cancelled Damanhur/ R 15 NO 24. Faint Cairo arrival behind, side panel lost but all message there, sl rough opening, looking neat **[ILLUSTRATED]** £25
- 125 1922 5m pink (HG 8, NP 9), Arabic-addressed, uprated with 10m First Fuad across flap – torn on opening and "restored" – Cairo b/w Reg label alongside, cancelled Cairo / R.A. 13 OC 25 and Cairo arrival behind. Neat example, cannot be opened £22

- 127 1930 Fuad embossed 5m light brown (HG 9, NP 10), French-addressed to lawyer in Cairo and uprated with marginal vert pair of 5m Second Fuads (with Cairo b/w Reg label) behind. Unusually, vignette cancelled with two pencil strokes while stamps behind have Cairo CDS 23 JL 34 7pm. Arrival CDS on front Cairo/ RA(2) one hour later. Full message survives, neat **[ILLUSTRATED]** £18
- 128 1930 Fuad embossed 5m light brown (HG 9, NP 10), Arabic-addressed, uprated with vert pair of 5m Second Fuad (mute b/w Reg label), cancelled Bab el Luq / Registration 28 AU 36. Faint Cairo Delivery behind, neat example with full message £18
- 129 1930 Fuad embossed 5m light brown (HG 9, NP 10), Arabic-addressed, uprated with 10m Boy King (mute b/w Reg label) and cancelled Bab el Khalq/(R) 3 XI 36. Faint Cairo transit and good unusual Ezbet el Zaitun arrival mark same day. Neat, colourful, full message £18
- 130 1930 Fuad embossed 5m light brown (HG 9, NP 10), Arabic-addressed, uprated 15m Second Fuad and 5m Postes. No reg label but ms indication and boxed AR hs on face and remains of AR card attachment behind. Cairo R.D. 3 DE 36 4.30P, and Cairo Delivery 5-6P behind. Unusual example **[ILLUSTRATED]** £20

Rough opening has removed flap (revealing Thos de La Rue imprint) and caused damage to upper part of vignette – a great shame., But still a great rarity **[ILLUSTRATED]** £55
- 134 Soldier's envelope – 1971. Two examples of uncut press sheets of Soldier's envelope intended for sending mail to serving troops at 10m rate, printed on reverse and used as post office registration forms (see NP page 695). Two strikingly different shades. Unusual £12

Very unusual **[ILLUSTRATED]** £36
- 136 1924, olive-buff envelope roughly addressed in Arabic, unfranked. On arrival marginal 10m lake of 1921-22 Dues set (Jubilee line above) applied and cancelled with Quwesna CDS 19 V 24. Another strike alongside. Most uncommon £28
- 137 1934, Advertising card of Capsalis Paleoroutas Beurrerie et Fromagerie, Tahta, franked 2m Second Fuad, Arabic-addressed. Pencil T2 alongside stamp, and 2m black 1927-56 Due applied on arrival (where is not clear). Card clean but twice folded, once through Due, hence £8
- 138 1930s? (date unclear). Celebration cover franked (damaged) 2m Fuad Postes, En Ville Alex. Hand-written T and 2m black and 4m green Dues (1927-56) on arrival. Cover scuffed, but unusual usage £12
- 139 1953, barid harby (military post) cover misplaced in normal PO, 50% strike Cairo Station 17 FE 53, Arabic addressed, large pen T, horiz pair 1927-56 Dues on arrival in Alexandria. Opened out for display £8
- 140 1953, printed company envelope franked patently reused 10m Marechal (not cancelled): boxed T and 8m and 12m Dues of 1927-56 issues applied on arrival in Alex. Good but for rusty original franking £12
- 141 1958, remarkable small note folded and sealed only with Marechal 4m, cancelled Alex-Cairo TPO (30%) of 26 AU 58. Transit T/ Mahalla el Kobra same day behind, and 12m Due (1927-56) applied top right on face on arrival and cancelled 60% strike of unusual El Ghazl Misr/Mahalla el Kobra/C same day 5.30pm £18
- 142 1964, Fine blue-printed envelope of Mohamed H Abdalla, Merchant, Sitty Street, Ismailia, with typed address, unfranked: unboxed T stamp and El Ismailia / T. CDS of 28 I 64. Cairo slogan-machine transit, 30m Due (1962, SG D734, Bal 623, NP 60) on arrival, cancelled Le Caire / D1. Unusual on cover £18
- 143 1988 – philatelic cover from 2/Cairo 25 MA 88, addressed to US and seems to have travelled. Franked with 2m,8m,10m,20m,40m (ie, full set) of 1965 Postage Dues issue (SG D852-6, Bal 656-60, NP 62-6), together with 2x5p definitives and 15p 1988 Postal Union commem. Clean and striking from front, though flap torn. Unusual to see these Dues on any sort of cover! £12

- 145 1921 – Folded letter sheet from Public Custodian, sealed with 2 black on blue Public Custodian/ of Enemy Property/ in Egypt / Cairo black on pale blue labels, franked 5m Sphinx, CDS 90% Dawawin/ Cairo 18 JL 21, addressed to Cairo company. Neat and clean £10
- 146 1938-52 – three covers with boxed T but no charge raised. 1, unfranked, Arabic-addressed to Cairo from Cairo/Z 16 NO 38. 2, unfranked, Arabic-addressed, resealed with red Arabic label (half lost on opening) cancelled with double-box square including central figure 9, Heliopolis 25 AP 45 via Cairo Station to Ismailia/ Traffic. 3, 10m Marechal, rusty, stamp and two boxed-Ts pen-cancelled, Arabic-addressed, Sidi Bishr Backstamp 28 OC 52. Intriguing lot £16
- 147 1958? (date not clear). Astonishing late use of straight-line Avis de Reception (all capitals, DE in smaller lettering) recorded only from early part of the century. Stamped across the top of an AR letter (typed Arabic instruction, no boxed handstamp) from Cairo to Giza, franked vert pair of 10m and 35m UAR Egypt definitives of 1958. Latest use known by at least 30yrs **[ILLUSTRATED]** £25
- 148 1960 – flimsy sheet typed in Arabic, folded and supplied with upright-R registration handstamp and oval handstamp Claims Office G.P.O./ Egypt / 5 NO 60, both in purple. Unusual £6
- 149 1963, Christmas card sent from Holland and returned as undeliverable (addressed to “First restaurant close by Police Station” in Cairo). On back are small bilingual boxed Insufficiently Addressed and large boxed trilingual Return to Sender; on face are incoming and outgoing Cairo machine marks (2 1 63 and 26 1 63) and boxed trilingual Unclaimed. Astonishing £24
- 150 1967, Printed Air Mail envelope of German-Arab Chamber of Commerce in UAR, typed address to Germany, franked 80m Egyptian Art Air (SG935, Bal 484, NP 463) together with Egyptian Cotton Finest Cotton Survey of Egypt stamp of 1964 (Feltus p.199, lower left), both with Cairo CDS of 6 II 67. Arabic censor mark lower right. No Backstamp, clean, unusual £8

- 151 Three cards with rettas – “Beauty”, franked 1m with Post Card crossed through replaced by handwritten Imprimés, from Alex Station 13 ?? 02 to San Stefano; boxed T cancelled by two strikes of rectangle retta (Smith p513, B2). Pyramid photocard franked 13m Boy King for Holland cancelled diamond retta, censored, no date. French-written 13m stationery card (Boy King, H&G39, NP40), uprated with 2x3m (one damaged), 5m and 20m Boy King for Istanbul, all cancelled diamond rettas. Purple censor, and Cairo machine mark 22 APR 1941 on reverse. Interesting lot £18
