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MonacoPhil 2019

Egypt stuns the world in Monaco with the most comprehensive exhibition of Egyptian philately ever produced. As a crucial part of its regular celebration, the Club de Monte-Carlo used Monacophil 2019 to present in 209 frames pretty well every philatelic treasure Egypt has produced.

This round of Monacophil included an exhibition dedicated to Egypt. Hany Salam, board member of the club, was the curator of the exhibition and managed to gather a fine assortment of items drawn from various royal collections, national archives and exhibits from the highest level of collectors of Egyptian philately. It is with no doubt the most important event in the 21st century for the Egyptian philately. The non-competitive exhibition, Treasures of Egypt, was graced by the patronage of Prince Albert II of Monaco and by the presence of ex-King Ahmed Fouad of Egypt, son of King Farouk, who showed enormous interest in examining many of the most significant exhibits from his native land.

The Egypt exhibition, which ran alongside a similar display of Maritime material, was a personal triumph for Hany Salam, he was able to launch his new publication, The Egyptian Maritime Postal History, 1845-1889.

The Musée de Timbres et des Monnaies, where the Club set up a special exhibition of the 100 world's most significant stamps and documents. Among the exhibitors was Her Majesty the Queen of England, Prince Albert himself, and Hany Salam. What an honour! Hany, the main driver behind the special Egyptian presentation, with the strong support of Patrick Maselis, president of the Club de Monte-Carlo, and Dr. Sherif Samra the president of the Egyptian Philatelic Society, was rightly praised for his organizational skills.
