

A Repeated error

Fine envelopes are distinctive and exciting items, and there are often various reasons behind them that led to taxing. The most important of which is that the value of the stamps affixed is less than the service price.

In some rare cases, regular postage stamps and official stamps were used instead of postage due stamps to collect the fine, due to the lack of postage due stamps at the post office in charge of the taxing. These cases led to great confusion among most collectors between the fine and the fees for keeping correspondence in the post office.

The service of storing correspondence at the post office was a common service and was used by many groups, the most famous of whom were expatriates. Incoming letters were kept at the post office for a certain period in exchange for a filing fee paid by the recipient, and stamps for the price were affixed to the envelope as proof of collecting the fee.





S.A.I.D.E Flights

In 1948 the Newly Formed Egyptian Airline "Service Aeriennes Internationeaux d'Egypte (S.A.I.D.E.)" had made its first flight which took place on the 23^{rd} of August from Cairo to Rome direct announcing the start of its new service every Monday and Friday, and a trip from Alexandria to Athens then to Rome on the 25^{th} of August and every Wednesday after that according to their program.

And to commemorate this event the Egyptian authorities has decided to use 1947 stamps of the 100 Mil and 200 Mil (control No A/47) to overprint on them "S.A.I.D.E. and the date of the first flight 23-8-1948 as shown below, the 100 Mil and 200 Mill were overprinted with new denomination of 13 Mil and 22 Mil respectively for foreign postcards and foreign letters and no airmail fee was added on the denomination or required on the flights until the 5th of September 1948 which after it any postcard or letter on S.A.I.D.E. flights became liable for extra 5 Mil as Airmail fee.

The work was done at the Government Printing Works which they Typographed 250,000 stamp of each value (Unsold Stamps were destroyed Later) and in which the erratic inking and poorly defined lettering were the characteristic of their work, the stamps were put on sale for One week only starting from 20th of August 1948 till the 27th of August 1948 and they were valid for postage until the 22nd of November 1948, the below Labels were printed to be used for Posts on S.A.I.D.E. Flights.






