<u>Two new Unrecorded Positional varieties – Express mail 20mil stamp</u>

Two confirmed unrecorded positional varieties found on the red 20 mil express postage stamp.

1- A white dot above the circle of the Arabic value on stamp No. 41

2- A diagonal line inside the foreign value circle on stamp No. 47

These positional varieties were confirmed once every two sheet with control number 28, 31, 32, and 36, while they disappeared in control number 39 and 40.

Express Stamps Overprints – "Palestine"

In 15th of May 1948 the day following the end of the British Mandate over Palestine, the combined forces of Egypt and other Arab countries marched to Palestine to return it to Arabs over the Proclaimed new state "Israel", the Egyptian forces succeeded to control some Palestinian territories in which Egypt had to Administrate them and provided some essentials goods and services to the Palestinian citizens in this territories, in June 1948 the Egyptian government decided to put to public the Egyptian stamps and to be Typographed by "Palestine - فلسطين" for the use in Palestine by the Palestinians and the Egyptian force in Palestine, the same Express stamp of the 40 Mil Domination which was used in Egypt Typographed with "Palestine - فلسطين" in Magenta or Red Colors by the "Government Printing Works", the stamps where as the same Egyptian stamps with with "Crown" and "-i" as a Watermark and with a Perforation of 13¼ x 13½
