'The Queen of Stamps'



Queen Elizabeth II (1926 – 1922) really was a stamp collector, and not only did she maintain the Royal collection, the Queen enhanced and developed this collection, as well as supported and encouraged the hobby. Inspired by her grandfather, King George V, Queen Elizabeth II took a real interest in organized philately.



Like her grandfather she became, in 1952, the Royal Patron of the Royal Philatelic Society London, the oldest philatelic society in existence, and visited their Devonshire Place premises in 1969, and their new premises in Abchurch Lane in 2019. On both occasions it was clear that her interest was indeed genuine and not just formality or ceremony, those who were fortunate to have been at these two events are on record as saying precisely that. And how many stamp collectors do you know who have spent £250k on a cover? Not many.



However, Queen Elizabeth II purchased the famous Kirkcudbright 1840 Penny Black first day cover in 2001, undoubtedly recognising its significance and no doubt the importance to the Royal collection. But don't go thinking that the Queen threw money around because she had wealth, because nothing could be further from the truth, the purchase was paid for by the proceeds of a sale of duplicates from the Royal collection which occurred in the same year.

The Queen has readily exhibited in the United Kingdom and overseas. She has generously allowed access to this fabulous collection - in fact such access has

never been so great as under her reign. This has aided the furtherment of the hobby by supporting specialists and experts to compare and study.

If all this wasn't enough to endorse the Queen's credentials as a great collector, then one of the most telling tales is that according to commentators who speak with heads of state staying at Buckingham Palace, the Queen is proud of her stamps so much that she loves showing them off to visitors. What a beautiful picture to underpin our respect to, a magnificent Queen for Great Britain and a wonderful Queen of stamp collecting. To 'The Queen of Stamps'.

The colors of the 1879 Egyptian stamps did not match the corresponding UPU defined colors of the 3 basic classes of international mail; 10 paras for printed matter (Violet vs. Green), 20 paras for postal cards (Blue vs. Red) and 1 plastre for letters (Red vs. Blue). That is why on December 24th 1883, Egypt ordered stamps in the new colors including changing the 5 plaster (Green to Grey) because the Green color will be adopted by the 10 paras.

The order was shipped in 5 consignments between February 20th and June 27th 1884. Records show a total delivery of 3,030,000 of the 10 para green and 1,764,000 of the 20 para red.



It was feared that the stock of the 20 para blue might run out before the new 20 para red arrived, and to use up the large stock of the 5 piastres green before the arrival of the new 10 para in the same color. Two birds could be killed with one stone by converting the 5 piastre stamps to 20 para by surcharging them locally.

Accordingly, the stock of 962,880 5p stamps (80% of the total printed) was surcharged by the Government Printing Works in Boulaq. The surcharging was done by lithography, on unseparated sheets of 240. The provisional was declared obsolete as of June 30th 1888 when the para currency was abolished.



The exhibit is devoted to the 1884 20 Paras Surcharge issue and its usage. It consists of proofs, stamps in blocks of four (Mint & used), printing varieties, and covers (including covers used abroad at the territorial offices in Sudan).

Rare & Unique items are marked with a RED Dot 🛑 while Scarce items are marked with an Orange Dot 🥚

Proofs exist in two forms: on thin white unwatermarked paper, perforated 13 $1/2 \times 13$ and on thicker paper with an aged appearance imperforate.

A folded sheet of 240 and a pane of 60 of imperforate proofs exist.

The perforated proofs are not known in large multiples (not known larger than a pair). The flaws on the pair and singles match those of the issued stamps.





Perforated proof pair printed on thin gummed unwatermarked paper perforated 13 x 13.5.

The right proof has the PRINT FLAW in '0' of position 31.

Proofs





Issue date & quantity: The stock of 962,880 5 piastre stamps (80% of the total printed) was surcharged by the Government Printing Works in Boulaq. The stamps were issued on February 1st 1884.

Sheets: Were made of 240 stamps (4 panes of 60 with gutters in between) with Current & Plate Numbers on the margins in opposing corners. The 20 Paras surcharge was done on unseparated sheets via Lithography

Plate numbers: Colorless numbers in bold, colored circles, and plate numbers begin with "1" for each denomination. The Plate Number appeared twice on each sheet (Top Left corner and Bottom Right corner). For most of these stamps one plate for each was sufficient to print all required stamps. <u>Thus this issue has number 1 only.</u>

Current numbers: Colored numbers in delicate rectangles with concave corners. The Current Number appeared twice on each sheet (Top Right corner and Bottom Left corner). Current numbers started with "1" for each country's stamps printed by De La Rue, and shouldn't repeat, so that the 5 paras plate shows current number "1", the 10 paras plate shows current number "2" and so on, with the <u>5 Plasters plate showing current number "6"</u>.

Upright Watermark



Block of 4 from the middle of the sheet with 2 stamps from the upper pane and 2 stamps from the lower pane with gutter in between.

Usage - Egypt

The 20 Paras provisional was used mostly in pairs to pay the ordinary letter rate.



14 October 1884, Letter from TC & Son in CAIRO to Ottoman Bank, Cairo, franked by SINGLE stamp of the 1884 20 paras, tied by bilingual CAIRE DEPART - مصر صادر circular date-stamp and an additional strike alongside. SINGLE usage is considered SCARCE-RARE

Usage - Abroad

Substantial quantities of them must have been sent to the military front in the Sudan, for cancellations of the Territorial Post Offices Wadi Halfa, Korti, Dongola, and Tani, which figured in the campaign to relieve the siege of Khartoum, seem to occur on this provisional more frequently than on the regular stamps.

Wadi Halfa وادى حلفة B. W. aristruther Engmeers

6 Dec 1884, cover from WADI HALFA to New Cross, England. Franked by pair of the 1884 20 paras on 5 piastres green, tied by bi -lingual WADI HALFA وادي حلفة - cancel. Arrived in New Cross on Dec 22 84 and READDRESSED to the Telegraph Battalion, Royal Engineers, Bechuanaland, South Africa. On reverse, there is an arrival date-stamp from Capetown dated Jan 16 85.

SCARCE REDIRECTED COVER

Souakin سواكن

22 Aug 1884 cover from Souakin to London. Franked by pair of the 1884 20 paras, tied by bi-lingual SOUAKIN - سواکن circular date-stamp. On reverse, there are intermediate Suez & Alexandria Date-stamps dated 29 & 30 Aug. There is also an arrival postmark from London dated 8 Sep, 1884.

Shifted Surcharge - (Double a'cheval)

Some sheets had the surcharge badly misplaced, in some cases so severely that one column of stamps was without the left inscription and the numerals 20, and thus had only the right side inscription, placed on the left side of the stamp

6 June 1884, letter from SUEZ to Cairo franked with a horizontal pair of the 20 Paras stamps and tied by Suez Depart circular cancel. The cover seem to have been posted on board a ship where it received a double ring Oval hand cancellation with M. S. AAKADI - SUEZ dated 4 June 1884. On reverse there is a Cairo Arrival cancelation dated 6 June, 1884.

Inverted 07 Surcharge - Block

It has been stated that 2,880 of the total 962,880 5 plastre stamps surcharged had the surcharge inverted. The inverted surcharge is found with both upright and inverted watermark (Scarce).



Top right marginal corner block of 4 with the corresponding Current Number 6 with inverted surcharge. (Upright watermark) The block has the printer's guidelines in both the top and right margins.

Current & Plate numbers of this issue with inverted surcharge are considered SCARCE

16 Feb, 1885 Nile Expedition - Soldier's cover from Korti to Cairo ;Franked with Provisional 1884 20 paras on 5 piastres green and 4th Issue 10 paras bluish gray in a vertical pair, all tied by Star and Crescent KOR-Tl / 16 FE 85 date-stamp with an additional strike below. Backstamped on arrival in Cairo 2 March 85.

1884 OHMS cover from Dongola to New Cross, London. Franked by pair of the Provisional 1884 20 paras, tied POSTE EGIZIANE / DONGOLA circular date-stamp (Wrongly dated 1880 in Arabic). Arrived in London on Dec 29 & 30 and then READDRESSED from New Cross to the Telegraph Battalion, Royal Engineers, Bechuanaland, South Africa. On reverse there is an arrival date-stamp from Cape Town Jan 22 85.

At the back, there are two intermediate postmarks from ASSIOUT - أسيوط and ALEXANDRIE ARRIVEE ما أسكندرية وارد dated 23 August, 1984. There is also an arrival postmark at the back from Godalming dated 31 August, 1884
