# CONSTANTA - ALEXANDRIA – CONSTANTA 1907 - 1939 Serviciul Maritim Roman (S.M.R.) - (Romanian Maritime Service)

The S.M.R. was established 7 June 1888, as a department of the Romanian Transports Ministry, to provide sea transport from Constanta, to and from the Levant, carrying general cargo, maritime mail and passengers. Over the years, the following five steamships served on this line: Romania, Imperatul Trajan, Dacia, Regele Carol I and, Pricipesa Maria.

The first Constanta to Constantinople service was on 26 September 1895. It was extended to Piraeus in May 1897 and then to Alexandria in June 1899. Haifa was added in May 1924 and Beirut in 1933. The route was then as follows: Constanta-Istanbul-Piraeus-Beirut-Haifa-Alexandria-Piraeus-Istanbul-Constanta. On 27 September 1914, at the onset of World War I. the Black sea entrance to the Bosphorus was mined by the Russian fleet and the service to the Levant suspended until November 1921. Except for minor interruptions, it continued, mostly on a weekly sailing basis, until the beginning of World War II.

Mail carried by S.M.R. ships was either regular post office mail, or mail taken to the company's offices to be carried by the next departing ship, or passenger "on board" mail. From 30 December 1906, a postal clerk went on each ship and mail received a postmark "Constanta-Alexandria" or "Alexandria-Constanta", depending on the direction of the ship. Different types of hand stamps were used over the years, sometimes for overlapping periods. No postmarks are recorded from 27 September 1914 until 9 October 1924. Mail posted on board, franked with Romanian stamps, was treated as internal mail.

This exhibit shows chronologically to the date of issue of postmarks, mail carried by the Constanta-Alexandria-Constanta S.M.R. maritime service. from 1907 to 1939, bearing the various postmark types in use during this period.

# OTTOMAN MAIL TO EGYPT

During 1907, the frequency of sailings was generally weekly, except for the period 12 to 25 July, when the Ottoman government imposed a quarantine in Constantinople. Ships had to be diverted to Smyrna and only one sailing took place during this fortnight.




Postcard mailed on board the "S/S Rumania", built in Saint Nazaire, France, in 1905. Type I cancel, dated 1st February 1907, originally from Constantinople, addressed to Cairo. Alexandria transit postmark dated 5 February 1907.

Franked: At the 10 para Turkish card rate.


Card from Alexandria. Type II cancel 20 October 1908. to Constanta. <u>Franked</u>: At the two mills Egyptian card rate.




Card mailed on board the `S/S Dacia; built in Saint Nazaire, France in 1907; while crossing the Aegean sea en route to Constanta. Type II cancel dated 4 January 1914. Addressed to Rome. Franked: At the 10 bani Romanian card rate.

Postcard (above, front and back) mailed on board the S.M.R. ship "Imperatul Trajan" en route from Romania to Egypt, type 11 cancel, dated 7 July 1907, addressed to Egypt. <u>Error of direction in postmark, should be "Constanta-Alexandria" instead of "Alexandria-Constanta"</u>

Franked: At the 10 bani Romania postcard rate.

There are no postmarks recorded between 27 September 1914 and 9 October 1924

The following type of cancellation, is recorded to have been used from 1924 to 1928. It exists inscribed "Constanta-Alexandria 1" of which only one item recorded and four inscribed "Alexandria-Constanta 1 - 2 - 3 and 4" of which only a couple of each are known.



Postcard from Palestine, type III cancel dated 9 October 1924, addressed to Romania. Constanta postmark 18 October 1924 on aid stamp. Franked: At the 50 bani Romanian card rate. Thus, considered as local mail which should have borne a 25 bani social assistance stamp. Taxed and a 50 bani social assistance stamp added on arrival, at twice the shortage.

## 1927 - CONSTANTA - ALESANDRIA

From 1927 until 1939. four different postmarks were used concurrently, for most of the period. Two using the spelling "Alexandria" and the later two "Alexandria".

Postmark with error of direction 'Constanta-Alesandria' instead of "Alesandria-Constanta".



Business letter taken to S.M.R. office at Alexandria. Type IV cancel dated 11 October 1927. to Turkey. Istanbul arrival 15 October 1927. Franked: At 15 mills Egyptian letter rate.

Commercial business cover, taken to S.M.R. office at Alexandria to be mailed on board. Type V cancel dated 1" June 1932, addressed to Turkey. Istanbul arrival backstamp dated 4 June 1932.

Franked: Total 10 lei letter rate, in Romanian stamps.





Alexandria arrival 8 June 1932. <u>Franked</u>: At 6 lei Romania card rate. Stamps perf-in "S R" for Steaua Romanei. <u>SELDOM SEEN</u>.





Letter from Lebanon to Egypt. Routing instructions <u>"Beyrouth-Alexandrie / Par bateau de la / Ligne Maritime Roumaine"</u>. Type VII cancel dated 26 April 1939. Alexandria arrival backstamp 27 April 1939.

<u>Franked</u>: At 6 plasters in Lebanese stamps, plus 75 cents in French stamps, to complete the 7½ piasters Lebanon foreign letter rate. Lebanon was at the time under French Mandate.
