I have been asked to write this Foreword to Jim Benians' detailed study of the Egypt Postage Prepaid datestamps.

In the following pages will be found details of these datestamps used not only by British troops but also by Australian, Indian, New Zealand and South African troops as well as the Free French and Polish forces fighting alongside them. Use by the Royal Navy and Royal Air Force, is also included.

Wherever possible the Egypt Postage Prepaid (EPP) datestamps have been identified with the FPO datestamps and post offices of the formations serving in Egypt and also with their unit censors. It is hoped, therefore, that this study will become the hub of an intensive research into the postal arrangements of the British Commonwealth and Allied Forces in Egypt and its neighbouring territories during WW2. From it should emanate local studies in complementary directions. This study has reached its present state as a result of the whole-hearted co-operation of many collectors and students, to whom I know the author is extremely grateful and without whose co-operation this work would never have been published.

## INTRODUCTION

To understand the circumstances leading up to the issue and subsequent use of the Egypt Postage Prepaid datestamps it is necessary to consider back to the years between the two world wars. At that time the British Forces stationed in Egypt were there as a result of a treaty concluded between the United Kingdom and Egypt. One of the articles of this treaty agreed that the Egyptian Ministry of Communications would be responsible for the carriage and forwarding of military mail to the UK and Ireland.

In 1932 the postage rate for mail sent by the British Forces to the homeland was raised from one piastre ( $2\frac{1}{2}$ d) to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  piastres, an increase which set off a storm of protest. As a result of these protests a special concessional rate of postage for Forces mail was negotiated with the Egyptian authorities. To obtain this concession members of H.M. Forces were required to prepay postage by purchasing specially printed stamps, or "seals", which were then stuck on the back of the envelope and cancelled by a Retta canceller. These seals were supplied by the NAAFI and could be purchased at their canteens in barracks, air stations and naval bases at a cost of 1 piastre each.

Special numeral franks were used in conjunction with this mail and were applied to the front of the envelope. These should not be confused with the subject of this study. Readers wishing to pursue this period of Egyptian military postal history in greater detail are recommended to read "Postal Service of the British Forces in Egypt 1932-1940" by J.E.O. Hobbs, and the works of earlier writers.

Compensation was paid to the Egyptian Government for loss of revenue.

Concession seals, franks and the Retta cancellers were withdrawn from use during February 1936, the seals being superseded by the large Army Post stamps with the portrait of King Fuad which were supplied by the Egyptian authorities. These came into use on March 1st 1936 and were affixed to the front of the envelope and cancelled by Military Post Office (MPO) datestamps.

On December 16th 1939 a further change took place, when smaller Army Post stamps bearing the portrait of King Farouk were introduced.

Following the outbreak of war on September 3rd 1939, Egypt was soon to become a major war base, as thousands of British and Dominion troops poured in. The newcomers were unwilling to accept the arrangement of handing over their outgoing mail to the Egyptian postal authorities, and to paying what they thought to be an undue postal charge into the bargain, and were soon to be forthcoming in expressing their objections. During 1940 attempts were made to have the existing postal arrangements revised, but it was not until April 1941 that there was any response from the Egyptian authorities.

Meetings then took place between the British and the Egyptian authorities, which finally agreed to a new approach to the handling of "Forces" mail in Egypt. A fuller account of these negotiations may be found in "The Mails went Through" by R.M. Startup of New Zealand.

The new arrangements dealt with the carriage of mails, postage rates, and a new type of datestamp to be supplied by the Egyptian authorities. The Egyptian Minister of Communications stated that these datestamps were to contain the word "Egypt" and were to be affixed to all free mail.

For obvious security reasons the military authorities would have preferred to have been allowed to use datestamps which concealed the country of origin of outgoing mail. However, the Egyptian authorities remained determined to include the name "Egypt" in the new datestamps. In the interests of a speedy settlement this condition was finally accepted by the British.

Thus the Egypt Postage Prepaid datestamps were born.

The newly agreed postal arrangements came into force on May 1st 1941, from which date the military authorities became responsible for the carriage of their own mail. Each contingent developed its own system of transferring outgoing mail from their Field Post Offices to their Base Army Post Office in Cairo, which in turn transported the mail in bulk to the port of embarkation or airfield, the reverse procedure being adopted for incoming mail.

Ordinary surface mail now became free, if addressed to the man's homeland, but other postal services had to be paid for at agreed rates. For the first time British and Dominion forces could buy and use the stamps of their own country in Egypt for this purpose. Stamps of an "Ally" were accepted. Mixed frankings of Australian, British, Indian, New Zealand or South African stamps are not uncommon.

Forces mail to civilians in countries other than the homeland were subject to normal Egyptian postal rates and were of course franked with Egyptian postage stamps. Excess postage was charged on letters to addresses in Egypt and the Sudan when their weight exceeded 30 grammes.

The mail of relatives of serving members of H.M. Forces still resident in Egypt and civilian employees serving with the Forces was not included in the agreement and was subject to the normal Egyptian postal rates.

All military mail including that of relatives and civilians attached to H.M. Forces was subject to unit censorship before being placed in the military mails. It was an offence for such mail to be put directly in the civilian postal system. Illustrations of the various types of censor hand stamps will be found in Chapter One.

It is not known whether Egypt received compensation for the loss of postal revenue from the discontinuation of the sale of the Army Post stamps.

At least the Egyptian postal authorities had been relieved of carrying the increasing volume of military mails, and were assured that the numerous types of Field Post Office datestamps previously in use were replaced by one standard type.

The new postage rates (for mail to the homeland of the troops) came into force on May 1st 1941 and were as follows:-

The EPP datestamps were handed over directly to General Headquarters who became solely responsible for their subsequent issue and security.

They were issued to static Field or Army Post Offices on the several lines of postal communications, where they served the various headquarters, leave centres, training areas, transit camps, airfields, ports, hospitals, and other such areas of heavy military populations.

Since these datestamps were issued mostly to static post offices we can expect little movement from them. If because of the fortunes of war a post office closed, or left the country, its EPP datestamp would be returned to GHQ. In the event of its subsequent return to Egypt, it is unlikely to have been re-issued with its original EPP datestamp, but would receive a completely new number.

Similarly, datestamps which showed signs of wear and needed replacement were also returned to GHQ who issued a new one in its place.

Field Post Offices belonging to operational formations passing through Egypt were not issued with EPP datestamps. It has not been established if such post offices continued to function whilst in transit through the country but if they had done so then it may be presumed that local arrangements would have been made for their outgoing mails to have been directed into the existing postal system.

A description of the various types of EPP datestamps will be found in the next chapter.

## 1.

DATESTAMP TYPES

The Egypt Pre Paid (EPP) datestamps supplied by the Egyptian authorities had the word "EGYPT" and an indicator number in the top segment and "POSTAGE PRE PAID" in the lower with a movable dateline through the centre. The first official date of use was May 1st 1941 though examples have been reported dated during the last few days of April. The Australians in particular are believed to have been quick off the mark in adopting their use. The Army Post stamps were withdrawn at the same time and after the first few days in May rarely appear cancelled with an EPP datestamp. The latest reported date of use was from EPP 32 on November 5th 1947.

The datestamps appeared in two forms - hand and machine types of cancellers.

The Hand-operated Datestamps

These datestamps were allocated serial numbers ranging from Nos. 1 to 155, and they can be sub-divided into four distinct types. They are believed to have been constructed of a composite material rather than metal.

Most of the datestamps appear to have been subjected to heavy use and soon began to show signs of wear. An attempt was made to prolong their life by fitting solid slugs to some of the dies, which had the effect of "packing" them.

Datestamps numbered 26, 40, 52, 55 and 71 were the first casualties and were withdrawn from use because of wear in early 1942. These were replaced with dies bearing the same numbers which are noticeably smaller in diameter. Numbers from 105 onwards are similar to these smaller replacement dies, a fact which lends support to the theory that all the datestamps were not manufactured or issued at the same time.

The datestamps issued to EPP No. 105 and above have been identified as Type IV.

By 1946, impressions from most of the datestamps then in use were generally poor and in some cases completely illegible.

The differences between the four types of dies fitted to the handstamps are summarised in the following table:-

### Machine Datestamps

In July 1942 an automatic EPP datestamping machine was brought into use at the British Army Base Post Office in Cairo. It was similar to those used in smaller main post offices in the United Kingdom, the two dateheads being separated by five wavy lines. (Type V). Impressions from this datestamp are usually sharp and clear and were generally applied to the reverse side of mail as a transit mark.

In March 1943 the wavy lines were replaced by a rectangular boxed slogan "It Pays to Lend" set in a cogwheel motif. The earliest recorded date of this is March 10th 1943. (Type VI).

The cogwheel motif gave a great deal of trouble in service principally because of poor inking and one sign of this was an uninked band running through the whole length of the postmark. The position of the band varies depending upon the various adjustments which were made to the tension in an attempt to eradicate this problem.

Albino or uninked impressions from the dateline also show a marked unevenness until finally the outer ring of one of the dies disappeared completely, leaving only the dateline. The earliest recorded date of this state is March 27th 1944 and the latest June 6th 1944 and is known as the "missing circle" variety.

On or about June 14th 1944 a new and larger die was fitted which was 28 mm in diameter against the 25 mm of its predecessor and of the remaining accompanying die. It had an enlarged star in the upper segment and the date line appears boxed. Impressions of the new die appear to have a "squashed-up" look and really clear ones showing this new datehead in any degree of clarity are scarce. (Type VIa).

On August 25th 1943 one of the dateheads was inverted and again on July 13th 1944. On the second occasion the date remained in its correct position in spite of the inversion of the die. The "slogan" remained in use until September 1945.





## 2.

PATTERNS OF USE

This book brings together most of the private studies known to the author. These have been amalgamated with the records of the Egypt Study Circle and the Forces Postal History Society to form a suitable base to re-examine the use of these datestamps.

There are no official records or documents to aid the research so each of the many students has had to establish his own reference sources and set his own objectives. It is not surprising that each brought a different emphasis and point of view to his study. This book is no exception in that it attempts to use and evaluate the evidence provided by the many unit censors who handled the envelopes which interest us.

The unit censor was the first person to handle the envelope (which reached him with flap unsealed) once it had left the writer. It was one of the duties of an officer to undertake the censoring of the men's mail. The unit's censor stamp was usually held in the orderly room where the censor would apply it to the mail. Only then was the mail ready to be forwarded to the Field Post Office. The unit censor stamp thus becomes the first link in a chain of evidence which will help us to locate a given EPP datestamp.

Once it has been possible to identify a unit, or formation via its unit's censor stamp, the next step must be to investigate the relationship between specific units and the individual APO/FPO until finally it is possible to link together the APO/FPO with a specific EPP datestamp. These are the links this book has begun to forge.

Presenting this data posed many problems. It had to be interesting and instructive to the general reader, whilst offering information in depth to the specialist collector.

To begin with a series of graphs was prepared, which, by using censor records, was able to show the use made of each datestamp by various formations. These proved quite conclusively that definite "Patterns of Use" could be observed and recorded.

For example, EPP No. 7 can be seen to have had three periods of use; first by the Australians, then by the RAF and finally by the British Army.

Others indicated the replacement of one formation by another, such as one might expect from a training area, while a mixed use indicated a hospital, headquarters or leave centre.

These graphs were then used as a basis to prepare chronological lists of the operating life of each datestamp, while at the same time retaining the bulk of the censor and unit information. It is hoped this knowledge will lead to the eventual discovery of any formation using a particular Army or Field Post Office and thus to its probable location.

An interesting example of this occurs with EPP No. 33. Some of the units using this datestamp towards the end of 1942 have been identified as forming part of the 10th Armoured Division which at that time was held in reserve completing its training behind the lines at El Alamein. From this it could be deduced that the Field Post Office using EPP No. 33 was functioning on the divisional lines of communication. It was in fact situated at the divisional supply point in the desert between El Alamein and Alexandria.

It also became clear from the data order of EPP postmarks that one type of censor marking was replaced by another with very little overlapping, thus supporting the belief that, for security reasons, one type of censor mark was replaced by another.

Datestamps in use with the RAF Headquarters, Cairo, are seen to have had comparatively short spells of duty, but were obviously subjected to heavy use. By tracing the censorship numbers of the static units it has been possible to construct a table of the datestamps in the order in which they were employed. This information can be found in Chapter Five.

Naval markings might indicate the probable location being in one of the major ports - Alexandria, Port Said, or Port Tewfik. Other datestamps are seen to have had connections with the smaller contingents over a considerable period of time.

Although some of the EPP datestamps may be associated with certain Indian Field or Army Post Offices, care should be exercised before an assumption may be made that the EPP and Indian FPO datestamps were currently in use in the same office. It was customary for the Indians to apply their datestamps on the reverse side of their mail. Scrutiny has shown that these may be dated several days earlier than the accompanying EPP datestamp. The difference may be explained when the Indian Forces concerned were operating outside Egypt, whilst their mail was routed through that country, the EPP datestamp being applied at the Army Post Office on the lines of their postal communications. It has been noted that when the Indian unit concerned was within the borders of Egypt itself, the time lag was not more than a day or so.

However it should be noted that in the instance of the use of EPP No. 13 with the Indian FPO No. 13, the two datestamps have been struck in the same coloured ink, and bear the same date. The accompanying Indian Base Post Office datestamp (Cairo) is approximately seven days later, and may indicate one of the few instances where the EPP datestamp was used outside the borders of Egypt itself.

The listing show that after 1942 the percentage of use made by the British fell, whilst that by the South Africans rose. After the Battle of Alamein the fighting line moved away from Egypt to North Africa and Italy. As the Mediterranean was re-opened the British mails were sent by the shorter route via Gibraltar. On the other hand Egypt was on the homeward route for the South African troops fighting in the battle zone. Although

this was the era of the Airgraph Service, air mailed letters were being received in South Africa a week or so after being posted.

The question must also be asked, were the conditions of the "agreement" always complied with, and the EPP datestamps wholly used on postal duties, or were the normal Field Post Office instruments brought into use on normal mail. In the case of the New Zealanders this is known to be so as there is no evidence that after the end of 1943 the EPP datestamps were used by them, but those of their Field Post Offices then remaining in Egypt were.

From 1945 onwards quite a different pattern emerges. Numerous datestamps were in use for comparatively short periods and were then showing signs of extreme wear. The general move now was back towards the Canal Zone. The troops were preparing the last great base, and congregating to form the drafts for demobilisation. Dominion troops were passing through and returning home. With this general movement and contraction, the postal arrangements could at times have only been on an "ad hoc" basis and only the usable datestamps brought into service, perhaps several at a time in the same office.

Recognition must be given for the detailed work already achieved in connection with the use made by the Australian and New Zealand contingents. Studies are in progress on similar lines in connection with that of the South Africans. To assist this a list of the South African Army Post Offices known to have operated in Egypt is appended. From the data already obtained tentative suggestions are made in a few instances of the EPP datestamps allocated to them, but it must be remembered that this particular facet of the study is still in its early stages.

It is hoped that the accumulated data already obtained will provide a groundwork and stimulus for similar work to be undertaken with other "users", particularly with our own forces.

A study of this nature cannot be separated from its complementary studies. The value of the tables can be enhanced only by the addition of still further data and its subsequent interpretation by the military postal historian, in the study of the postage stamps employed by a philatelist, and in the research to understand the circumstances in which the serviceman or his unit were in at the time by a military historian. To this must be added the expertise of the student of censorship.

This mail reflects the movements of the men in whatever capacity employed, in training, on leave, in the field of battle, hospitalisation, or just waiting to go home.

## 3.

UNIT CENSORSHIP

The responsibility for censorship in Egypt and the Middle East was in the hands of the Chief Field Censor. This was one of the functions of a department in British Intelligence at General Headquarters in Cairo. Certain responsibilities were delegated to the Deputy Field Censors in charge of security in each of the contingents. The subject of censorship is complex and although markings of the departments appear on mail bearing EPP datestamps, for the purpose of this study only the Unit Censor markings are dealt with in detail.

On arrival in Egypt newcomers fell in line with the existing arrangements, and in a short space of time their own censor stamps were withdrawn and they were issued with one of the type then in current use. Each unit was allocated its own particular stamp and it was the duty of the officers to censor their men's mail. This act of censorship identified the mail with its unit of origin.

In the interests of uniformity the Forces Postal History Society's system of identification and numbering of the various types has been adopted and those of the Egypt Study Circle are identified.

## 4.

THE MILITARY POSTAL ORGANISATION

Very little has been written on this subject covering the overall framework of the British Military Postal Organisation in Egypt during the second world war. A brief and general outline may be of some help to understand how the EPP datestamps fit into the scheme of things.

It is fortunate that there are very detailed accounts available to those relevant to the Australian, Indian, New Zealand, and South African contingents. From these a general picture of the system to which they were linked may be drawn.

The British Base Army Post Office (BAPO4) was situated in Cairo in Sharia Mashero, and each of the contingents had its own Base Post Office either in or nearby to it:-

The British Base Post Office also had direct liaison with GHQ, the RAF HQ, The Censorship Dept, and The Egyptian Civil Postal Authority. It was in effect the central exchange point for each of the various systems and a considerable volume of mail passed through in transit from one to another.

It also established its own system of Army or Field Post Offices and was responsible for the carriage of mails between them. These were the offices established in the various General Headquarters, hospitals, ports, training areas or where there were large concentrations of military personnel.

Other offices were established to serve the units operating in the field. These were mainly at Division or Brigade Headquarters and were usually to be found near its supply point.

To all the offices established on the lines of postal communications the units in the vicinity would bring in their own outgoing mail and collect the mail waiting for them. At the same time the unit postal courier would transact postal business on behalf of the men, send parcels, bank monies, buy stamps and postal orders. Returning to his unit he would distribute their mail to the men, and if the unit was dispersed over a wide area, such as might be the case with an Artillery Regiment, a round trip of five hundred miles or so was not uncommon.

In the field the more important offices were housed in large army tents and were easily picked out by the piles of mail waiting to be collected. The smaller ones which were continually on the move centred around their three-tonner trucks with a canopy to protect their mail. The postal orderlies were a hard-working set of men, who went to great lengths to keep the mails on the move and this did much to keep up the morale of the men.

It was to these offices on the lines of postal communication that the EPP datestamps were issued and this explains why there are such a great variety of unit censor markings to be found on the correspondence they franked.

From June 1940 until the end of 1943 most of the ordinary mail and parcels from overseas were shipped via Port Tewfik, Ataka and Adabiayak in the bay of Suez. After the end of 1943 when the Mediterranean had been opened it was possible to utilize Port Said and Alexandria in addition.

Summer 1941.**






Diagram To Show The Principle Of The Lines Of Postal Communication.

SOUTH AFRICAN ARMY POST OFFICES IN EGYPT

At present there is little information from which to identify the EPP datestamps with the various South African Army Post Offices to which they were allocated. However in 1946 the Director of the South African Postal Service did issue a list of the movements and locations of the various offices. From this an extract of those offices serving in Egypt has been prepared as a basis on which to identify the EPP datestamps allocated to them.

#### BRITISH ARMY

We know of no work that has been prepared in detail in connection with the use of EPP datestamps by the British forces, but would invite interested collectors of this material to join in to produce a listing on the lines of those of the other contingents.

THE AIRGRAPH SERVICE TO EGYPT

The entry of Italy into the war in June 1940 resulted in the closure of the Mediterranean to civilian traffic and the withdrawal of fast mail ships, and led to a slow service round the Cape to Egypt from the United Kingdom. A serviceman took at least eleven weeks to reach Egypt if sent by sea transport by this route, and a letter telling of his safe arrival in Egypt took as much time again.

The Post Office investigated the airgraph as a possible answer to reduce the long delay in communication and to relieve the anxiety it caused.

Airgraph letters were photographed on microfilm and a film of 1600 - 1700 letters with its canister weighed five ounces. These could be packed into military aircraft already loaded with priority cargoes. (The contents of one canister was equal to a mail bag of approximately fifty pounds weight).

The homeward route was as follows: from Cairo, south to Khartoum, then west to Takoradi on the Gold Coast and north to Lisbon and London. The average time taken for correspondence to travel by this means was about three weeks.

By August 1941 Cairo was able to receive and develop microfilm. The peak was reached in 1943 and the service finally ceased in 1945. Its phasing-out coincides with a marked increase in the number of EPP items recorded addressed to the United Kingdom.

(During this latter period Service Air Mail letters were carried at 1½d each and finally were "FREE").

Airgraphs were subjected to censorship and are of interest in that both the unit of the sender and the censorship stamp appear on the heading. This information may help in the identification of the unit with its censor stamp in the Tables of Use.








