Egypt Postage Prepaid Military Datestamps 1941-47 ***

The book under the above title by the late F.W.('Jim') Benians, published by the National Philatelic Society, brought together a wide range of information about these intriguing datestamps, and also posed questions, mainly through the lack of official information.

Recently I had the pleasure of discovering a copy of the official datestamp allocation list dated 12 August 1941, from the British Army Postal Directorate MEF to the 2 NZEF Postal Directorate, and found in a bundle of New Zealand files that had, amazingly, escaped destruction.

This list is repeated below - in it I have translated the British APO codes to Division or Brigade designations (based on the British Postal Standing Orders*) though I am unsure what LEA represents. Comparison of the list with Benians' book will raise further queries, but it is clear that there was movement of the datestamps between the forces - this list shows the position at one particular date. The New Zealand 'office* allocations are those written by the NZ DADPS.

Datestamp 91 had been returned to 4 Base APO on 26 February 1942 as unserviceable. 25 and 92 were held as spares from early April 1942 by NZ Chief Post Office, the units concerned having left Egypt.

(we are grateful to Mr.Startup for giving us the opportunity to reproduce the above list, the first official allocation of these datestamps that has ever been available to postal historians.

Without going into the comparison of the list above with that of Jim Benians,or the list given by Proud's Vol.III, there appears to some confusion as to APO numbers allocated to datestamps 24 and 26, the former being given APO S209 - Moascar, and the latter APO S209 - Tel-el-Kebir, as both cannot be right b209 was at Tel-el-Kebir, whilst the APO at Moascar was S205.

It is interesting to note that only datestamps from 1 to 105 had apparently been allocated by August 1941. Later datestamps up to 155 were issued. ED.)
