### MARKET JOTTINGS.

#### by Colonel W. Byam, O.B.E.

Even from the heights of Ethiopia the elevation of the market at H. R. Harmer's auction on April 3rd. 1951 seems immense. Seventeen lots of Egypt came up for sale. One failed to reach the estimated value, by twenty shillings; Suez Canal, 40c pink, used, which fetched £29. The stamp was not too heavily postmarked, had good margins but a minute corner crease. One other lot sold for less than catalogue value : 1874, 10 para grey lilac, mint block of four, perf  $13\frac{1}{4}$  X  $12\frac{1}{27}$ , with T.B. pair, which realised £9. These compound perf. T.B. pairs are scarce and I was delighted to secure for my own collection, through the kindness of my good friend John Gilbert, now guiding the Circle so ably in my stead, the mint block of four of the 1 P.T., bright red, for fl4, though catalogued at fl0. The stamps are not well centred and, as usual with this perf. variety, they are on the thin oily paper which has been gummed after perforation, so that traces of gum appear on the face of the stamps. I mention these details for the guidance of others, as they are characteristic of the genuine article. The rarity of this variety may be appreciated when I record that this is only the third specimen I have had an opportunity to bid for during twenty sevet years while I have collected Egypt and the first I have secured.

The remaining fourteen lots exceeded their estimated values and their prices in the catalogue, by amounts up to 400%. the highest price was realised by a superb mint block of six,Suez Canal, 1 cent black. Estimated value £20; I bid £35; it realised £80. From the illustration I guess this block comes from the N.W. corner of the sheet. Mint blocks of four of the 5 cent., 20 cent. and 40 cent, the last two from the corner of the sheet, sold for £18. A block of sixty of the 29 cent, blue, with complete watermark, Le & F, realised £16-10., though its estimated value was £7.- which makes me doubt whether the auctioneers realised this was a watermarked piece.

Two bisects of the 1867 issue demonstrated the demand for out\_of-the-way pieces of Egypt, in Egypt, at present. 10 para, dull lilac, well tied to a piece of a newspaper ( the catalogue said "circular" ), obliterated The Quarterly Circular. Vol. III. No. 12. Page 152.

V.R. POSTE EGIZIANE - ALESSANDRIA - 12 DIC 1871 T III, which, estimated to be worth £10, fetched £42. The forgeries I have seen of this item bear pmk. POSTE EGIZIANE. The second piece was 1 P.T., bright rose, used on a fragment of what would seem to be an official form, on which is printed in black above the adhesive BOLLO DELL' UFFIZIO. The obliteration is the same Type as that seen on the other bisect; the date appears to be 1870 T.I. again used at Alessandria. This specimen sold for £40 ( estimate £10.) which strikes me as an abnormally high price, as there is doubt about the status of the specimen: it may represent fiscal usage only. There is a similar specimen in the collection at Buckingham Palace which Sir Edward Bacon and I viewed with suspicion and of which I was allowed to obtain a photograph.

Other notable prices were 1874, perf 12, 2 P.T., yellow, lightly postmarked, horizontal tete-becke pair: £30. Perf. 13, X 12, 2, P.T., violet, mint block of six with T.B.: £48. The estimated value was £20., but evidently the buyers realised better than the auctioneers that this last is one of the great rarities of Egypt. It is unpriced by S.G..

Though away from the Gircle I hope to keep in touch with my friends by watching the market on their behalf.

#### DETAILED DESCRIPTION. SUEZ.

Type I. Crowned Circle Frank Stamp.

I-1. Two concentric circles both of which are intersected at the top by a Crown. The circles are flattened slightly on the top - the horizontal diameters are 23 and 21 mm. - the vertical diameters are 22 and 20.5mm. The Crown is 7 mm. high by 10 mm. wide. Within the circles is " PAID at SUEZ " in three lines. The letters of " PAID " and " SUEZ " are 3 mm. high, while those of " AT " are only 2 mm. high. The stamp has been seen by us struck in black only, but it may possibly have been struck in red.

Issued at Suez on 16 July 1847. In black. Barliest date 27 Apl. 1859. (Hinde) Latest date 27 Mar. 1860.

Rawson possesses a piece of an original cover which bears the Suez Crowned Circle, accompanied by a circular date stamp of 31st July 1882; more than four years after the closure of the British Office at Suez. The date is evidence that the old franking hand stamp was called into use again during the period of Arabi Pasha's rebellion, when the Egyptian Postal Service was not available, and before the British Military Postal Unit took up its duties early in August 1882.

#### TYPE II. DATED CIROULAR MARKINGS.

II-1. SUEZ in Roman capitals in the upper half of a double circle. Letters 3.5 mm. high - outer diameter 25.5 mm., inner diameter 19.5 mm. Date in two lines, figures 2.5 mm. to 3 mm. high. Beneath the date the code letter "A", 3 mm. high. Issued on the same date as Type I-1 16 July 1847 and spperseded by Type II-2 on 2 August 1859. The Quarterly Circular. Vol. III. No. 12. Page 161.

The stamp was struck only in black.

Earliest date. 21-1-57. (McGowan.) Latest date. 20-9-57.

II-2. A single circle 18.5 to 19 mm. in diameter. In the upper half of the circle is the word "SUEZ" with code letter "A" over it height of letters 2.5 mm. width of SUEZ 11 to 11.5 mm. In the lower half the date in two lines 2.5 mm. high.

First used on August 2nd. 1859 and the stamp was struck in both black and blue.

II-3. A single circle 19.5 mm. in diameter. In the upper half of the circle is the word SUEZ with code letter "A" over it - height of letters 3 mm. - width of SUEZ 12.5 mm. In the lower half, the date in two lines 3 mm. high. Stamp struck in black only.

Earliest date. 21-5-70. (McGowan) Latest date. 14-2-78.

Note. The difference between Types II-2 and II-3 is similar to that of Alexandria - the latter is more solid in appearance, with a thicker circumferential line. The lettering is also slightly larger. From dates examined, Type II-3 would appear to have succeeded Type II-2.
